There are two tourist information offices in Liverpool, one situated at the Albert Dock and the other near St. George's Hall. I would suggest you address the tourist information office at the Albert Dock for any queries you may have during your stay, since this is quite close to your hotel.	Please, make sure you visit the Tourist Information office webpage before departure to plan any other activity you would like to do. There's plenty to do and see in Liverpool and we cover the major highlights, but you have free time and you should make sure you enjoy it to the full: http://www.visitliverpool.com/	Since you are at the Queens Dock and we'll visit the Albert Dock, you should not miss the Pier Head, one of the most impressive waterfront areas with three emblematic buildings: The Royal Liver Building, The Cunard Building and the Port of Liverpool Building, referred to as The Three Graces.	For drinks, beer, one of the agents at the tourist information office has suggested The Bierkeller at Liverpool One. Both he and the receptionist at your hotel have suggested Liverpool One as a place to go hunting for (cheap) food.
